

Route 1 Mini Adventure

Start at Seacombe Ferry Terminal & take in the wonderful view of the Unesco World Heritage site that is the Liverpool waterfront. A nine mile traffic free journey awaits with no hills to climb!

Within a mile is Vale Park. Possibly too soon to stop for break but if you need an excuse there's a cafeteria & maybe a performance at the band stand. A mile further on is the historic seaside resort of New Brighton. Follow the coast past two golf courses & a lighthouse & see the lovely beaches that you wouldn't know existed if you were in a car. Finish at Hoylake, venue of the British Open Golf Championship 2006.

There's a park & lots of interesting shops here. Good choice of restaurants, café's & pubs for lunch. Now ride back to Seacombe, continue your journey by train or let us collect your bikes.

ROUTE 56

Stretching from Southport to Chester via Liverpool & Wirral. Suitable to people wanting to cycle a bit further & possibly return by train. Merseyrail is very cycle friendly & does not charge for bikes.

Scope to incorporate a trip on the Mersey Ferry. The route from Storeton to Parkgate is one of our favourites. Passing near the Brimstage Craft Centre (good spot for a tea break) & through Thornton Hough - one of Wirral's prettiest villages before finishing with a home made ice cream at Parkgate.

Seacombe to Wallasey golf Course via New Brighton is another lovely stretch.

Most but not all of Route 56 is traffic free.
